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research methods thoroughly covers both quantitative and qualitative oriented research unlike many texts which begin with an introduction to research and then move directly to how to conduct research this text develops critical thinking skills about research and is designed to produce knowledgeable and informed critical research consumers each chapter builds on the information in preceding ones to focus on the importance of research methodology and interpretation rather than many competitors traditional coverage of statistical calculations and analyses the thorough and extensive coverage of all research methods combined with a focus on critical thinking makes this text truly unique

this student friendly book demonstrates how to take a critical approach to the research design process to create feasible original and critical research works the author uses a unique model that incorporates three critical review cycles methodological design epistemology and completed research plan in order to ensure that readers have critically engaged with various components of the research proposal approaching research design as a coherent whole this book focuses on critically understanding how the various components come together as a cohesive and interconnected design as well as to explore how the same basic research idea can lead to a number of different research designs including sections on both conceptual and methodological designs readers are equipped with the skills and knowledge needed to take a basic research idea and conceptualize a complete and organic design for a research based on it that can make an original contribution to the existing body of knowledge covering quantitative qualitative and mixed methods approaches and addressing the ethical implications of research this is an essential resource for researchers instructors and students across a broad range of disciplines in the social and behavioral sciences and humanities

this handbook highlights the growing tensions surrounding the current dominant ethical clearance model which is increasingly being questioned particularly in critical research it draws on stories from the field in critical research conducted in a range of contexts and countries and on an array of topics the authors involved in this collection encountered dilemmas contradictions and surprises that brought about a change in their understanding of ethics throughout the book they discuss how ethics is an ongoing and situated struggle that requires researchers at times to traverse traditional ethical imperatives four sections lead readers through the complexities of grounded ethical practice encountering systems including ethics committees and institutions blurring boundaries within research the politics of voice anonymity and confidentiality and power relations in researching down up and alongside this handbook is a resource for social science researchers using critical methodologies across a range of disciplines as well as for students and teachers of ethics in navigating the quandaries of doing good while doing good research

this volume features the works of scholar practitioners who embrace critical pedagogy and critical research as praxis in qualitative research about education the authors take an explicit stance toward social justice through education and they use critical research as a vehicle toward that end the chapters critically engage with topics such as researcher role and position in critical research collaborative research models with teachers and students exploring visual epistemology in schools and with students critical science education and cosmopolitanism and developing praxis within teacher preparation courses and teacher research contributors push the boundaries of scholarship by presenting nuanced theoretical discussions or critical and timely educational issues via innovative forms of representation i e fiction narratives dialogues rich descriptions and visuals this book was originally published as a special issue of the international journal of qualitative studies in education

based on the seminal text from the beginning of the twenty first century doing critical management research sage 2000 alvesson and deetz have broadened their focus to provide an authoritative and insightful framework for navigating critical theories and methods across all of the social sciences

this book brings together a collection of case studies and readings on the subject of doing research in education it differs from other texts in taking a personal view of the experience of doing research each author presents a reflexive account of the issues and dilemmas as they have lived through them during the undertaking of educational research the collection fills the space often referred to in critical research as the phenomenon of the missing researcher coming from the researcher s own perspectives their positions are revealed within a wider space that can be personal political social and reflexive with this approach many issues such as ethics gender race validity reciprocity sexuality class voice empowerment authorship and readership are given a much needed airing

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
